Bach Musica NZ is one of New Zealand's most highly acclaimed musical organizations, made up of a professional orchestra and a 45-voice auditioned choir. conducted by Rita Paczian. Rita Paczian and Bach Musica NZ gifted us a timeless expression of grief and triumph from the stage of the Auckland Town Hall last night.
